Chennai, formerly known as Madras, was an important colonial city during British rule. Established in 1639 by the British East India Company, it became a major trading post due to its strategic location along the Coromandel Coast.

3. Kolkata  
Kolkata, formerly Calcutta, was the capital of British India from 1773 to 1911. It was a major center for trade, education, and the freedom struggle. The city was also the birth place of the Bengal Renaissance, a period of social, cultural, and intellectual reform.
4. Amravati  
Amravati, in the state of Maharashtra, is known for its ancient temples and cultural history. Historically, it was part of the Satavahana Empire and later the Vakatakadynasty.
5. Jaipur  
Jaipur, the capital of Rajasthan, was founded in 1727 by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II. Known as the "Pink City" due to its distinct pink-colored buildings, Jaipur is famous for its planned architecture and majestic palaces like the City Palace and Hawa Mahal.
